Congratulations to the Ag Class Again

The 9/10/11 Ag class had a great day at the Royal Adelaide Show Wether competition in week 8. A total of 37 schools with 70 teams of 3 wethers competed this year, which is the biggest this competition has ever been. The achievement includes bringing home the blue ribbon (1st) and also 4th in **the highest weight gain, a second prize for the 'most professional school show team' and seventh in the meat value competition.**

Planning for 2021 has already started and next year we might take a different approach and have the two teams target different categories with the goal of winning ribbons in every category.

Year 7/8 Science - Body Systems

This term the class has been finding out about some of the main systems within the human body. Before we started students were asked to provide **answers to questions, such as** 'How many bones in an adult body?' Answers ranged from as few as 165 up to 267. They now know the answer is 206 bones. Each hand contains 27 bones allowing movement and dexterity. Students made their own basic robotic hand using straws and string. When finished, some of the hands were able to pick up a ping pong ball.

To investigate the concept of muscle fatigue students rotated through stations, trying different physical activities, including lifting a 2-litre container above their head, balancing a book on their palm and lower arm and compressing a peg. Most students were able to achieve a higher rate of compressions with their dominant hand in comparison to the other hand.



SAPSASA in 2020

It has been a busy term with several Year 6 & 7 students participating in trials for NYP district teams. There were a number of students who earned selection and represented our district in Adelaide at the State Carnivals. A great achievement getting selected in these representative teams in 2020.

Keeley Hewett, Madison Schell, Lylah Daniel and Karsha Ireland played in the NYP **Girl's Soccer team in the State Carnival in Adelaide in Week 6. Despite not having a** huge amount of soccer experience in the team the girls competed well and finished 5th overall in their division.

WIND POWER

Our challenge was to create a wind turbine that can hoist the most weight.


The materials we could use were spoons, straws, plastic cups, masking tape, string and A4 card. The science in the challenge was to get the blades to spin and to see how much weight we could pull up. The challenge was to get the straws to turn the blade. The process of designing and making the turbine to create the wind power required using maths by measuring and using the best shapes to create blades for the turbine. Also the size of the tower and blades was very important. We will test each groups designs and see which one works best.

Solar Power

Solar Power

Years 5 and 6 Technology




In Technology the Year 5/6 class have been completing design challenges using the *Maker's Empire* app.
