



The Andy Thomas Space Foundation and Makers Empire Scholarship

The Andy Thomas Space Foundation (ATSF) and Makers Empire recently announced a scholarship for nine South Australian primary schools to take part in an exciting new program designed to deliver education in awareness of space career opportunities. The program is sponsored by the ATSF Education Fund, with a total scholarship value of \$45,000. Port Broughton Area School has been announced as a scholarship winner, with staff members Cendall Cowan and Jess Bawden leading our participation in the program.

The program includes two days of professional development, support to design an authentic and engaging space-themed educational program incorporating STEM, and culminates in a student-led expo to showcase student learning in November. The showcase will be held at the Australian Space Discovery Centre in Adelaide. As part of the scholarship, each participating school will receive a new 3D printer to assist with their education program.

Minister for Education John Gardner said this is an exciting opportunity for students', "These young South Australians are part of a generation that will help build our growing space industry and this program will inspire them to shoot for the stars... South Australia is the epicentre of the nation's space industry, so we are perfectly placed to offer this Australian-first pilot program and encourage children to consider a future that's out of this world."

The first professional development day will be held in Week 1 of Term 3. More details about our school's project will be shared in future newsletters.

Maritime Art Exhibition Celebrating the Club's 21st Year in Port Broughton's 150th Year

On the June long weekend, the Port Broughton Sailing and Boat Club, held their annual maritime art exhibition, celebrating the club's 21st birthday in Port Broughton's 150th Year.

To acknowledge these two events the club held a public cake cutting ceremony to recognise and honor the town's founding fathers and its deep maritime history.

In the cake cutting party was Jan Arnold, granddaughter of one of the early Harbour Masters from 1890-1917.

Sherrie Simms-Farmer, daughter of Ben Simms, who had the vessel 'Mary Ann Simms' moored at Pt Broughton for many years. Mona Barnes the matriarch of the Barnes fishing dynasty, and Mark Rush, founding Commodore of the PBSBC. The community and visitors were treated to a vast variety of 340 paintings, 150 from the Port Broughton Area School and works from both Minlaton District School, Vineyard Lutheran School, Clare, and Studio Surf Art Classes Ballara, Warooka, students entered the youth art competition for the Isaac Thompson Eley Memorial Trophy, the Royston Cooper Eley Memorial Trophy and People's Choice Award.

The winners were, Under 12 Riley Stubberfield - Minlaton District School. Over 12 Amber Cameron Pt Broughton Area School. People's Choice - Dakota Pedler-Ward, Vineyard Lutheran School. **Encouragement Awards** - Adelaide Wright, Dakota Pedler-Ward, Isaac Victor, Olivia Cook, Ellie Polkinghorne, Emily Henriques-De-La-Fuente, Danni Newton, Amber Cameron. Adding colour to the 190 pieces from artists all around the region. There were displays, information, sculptures of the town fathers and a 3 metre long likeness of the sailing vessel 'The Triumph'. Stalls and written histories of the generations of the local boat builders and fishing families kept the patrons engrossed. Visitors were treated to free cake and coffee, if they wished, and background shanties, with many never before seen photographs of the town and personalities. The support of local businesses and patrons was very much appreciated. The quality of the exhibition was once again, made by the work of our volunteers that was beyond belief and the exhibition's success was due to their dedication, support and determination.


