

This Term our school was selected in the Andy Thomas Space Pilot Project. The showcase event is where our students will display their design of a new International Space Station module. Using the design making process students will select ideas, make a prototype (an example) and test, to then adjust their design accordingly. Students will then use Makers Empire (3D computer program) attending a Showcase Event in Adelaide. This is an opportunity for students and teachers to share and celebrate their design thinking projects with an authentic audience. The event is the culmination of nearly two terms work in the Andy Thomas Space Pilot Project.

# Festival Choir 2021

For the past 11 years I have had the absolute pleasure of teaching and running our Festival of Music choir. Early in Term 1, I travel to Adelaide and join with approximately 350 other teachers from all over South Australia to learn a new set of songs. I then come back to school and pass on this learning to our students who choose to join choir. We travel to Moonta for a combined rehearsal where a conductor from Adelaide joins us to make sure we're on track. A few weeks before our final performance in Term 3, the whole choir travels to Adelaide for a rehearsal with around 400 students and get to sing with a live orchestra. This prepares them for their final performance which is usually at the Festival Theatre. This year was a little different as the Festival Theatre is being renovated, so as in 2017, we had to move to the Adelaide Entertainment Centre. This meant that instead of a 400 voice choir, there were over 1300 choristers as well as a full sized orchestra and dance troupe. Being at the Entertainment Centre meant a lot more room for the dance troupe as well as some amazing animated projections on the ground. Amid what could only be described affectionately as organised chaos, our students were outstanding, not only in their performance but in their behaviour and attitudes. I am extremely proud of each and every one of them, and congratulate them for taking a risk in their learning, and reaping the amazing reward of performing in a venue usually reserved for high level celebrity artists. Thank you also to the dedicated parents who got them there and back safely. Without you going the extra mile, it would not have been possible.
