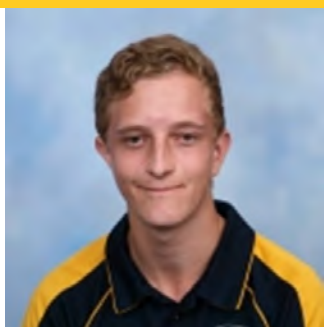

Food Technology

The enticing aromas that have been wafting around the steps this term is due to the efforts of the Stage 1 Food and Hospitality students and the Year 9/10 Food Technology elective group. Our stage one students have cooked both savoury and sweet dishes including apricot chicken, chicken korma, butter chicken, chocolate ripple cheesecake towers and a steamed chocolate cake using the thermomixer.



Year 9 and 10 students have created recipes influenced by cuisines from around the world. They experimented with spices to make butter masala chicken, chicken mogul style and Indian yellow split peas dhal. Pasta dishes from Italy included cannelloni, ravioli and sweet potato gnocchi with three cheeses. Students also made several delicious Italian inspired biscuits – Sicilian cream biscuits, biscotti and chocolate dipped Italian butter cookies. Recently, we have looked at the Greek cuisine, with a gyro being very popular as was the two different biscuit recipes, koulourakia and melomakaroma.
