# Exploring Vietnam: A Journey of Culture, History, and Reflection



During the recent school holidays, Year 11 student Karsha Ireland travelled to Vietnam as one of 19 recipients of the Premier's Anzac Spirit School Prize. Her outstanding biography of local Anzac veteran Richard Ireland earned her a place on this prestigious study tour, which offered rich opportunities for cultural immersion and historical reflection.

Karsha's journey began in Ho Chi Minh City with visits to the Reunification Palace and Cu Chi Tunnels, highlighting Vietnam's wartime past. She also explored Vung Tau, a popular rest site for Australian troops, and paid her respects at the Long Tan memorial, which was an especially meaningful experience for the tour group.

Further north, Karsha visited the historic town of Hoi An, where she attended a traditional cooking class and cruised the Perfume River on a dragon boat. In Hanoi, she experienced a traditional water puppet show and explored the bustling city by bicycle.

A highlight of the trip was an overnight cruise through the stunning Ha Long Bay. The tour provided Karsha with powerful insights into Vietnam's history, culture, and natural beauty. Year 9 and 10 students are currently working on biographies of service personnel and are encouraged to enter this year's Anzac Spirit competition.

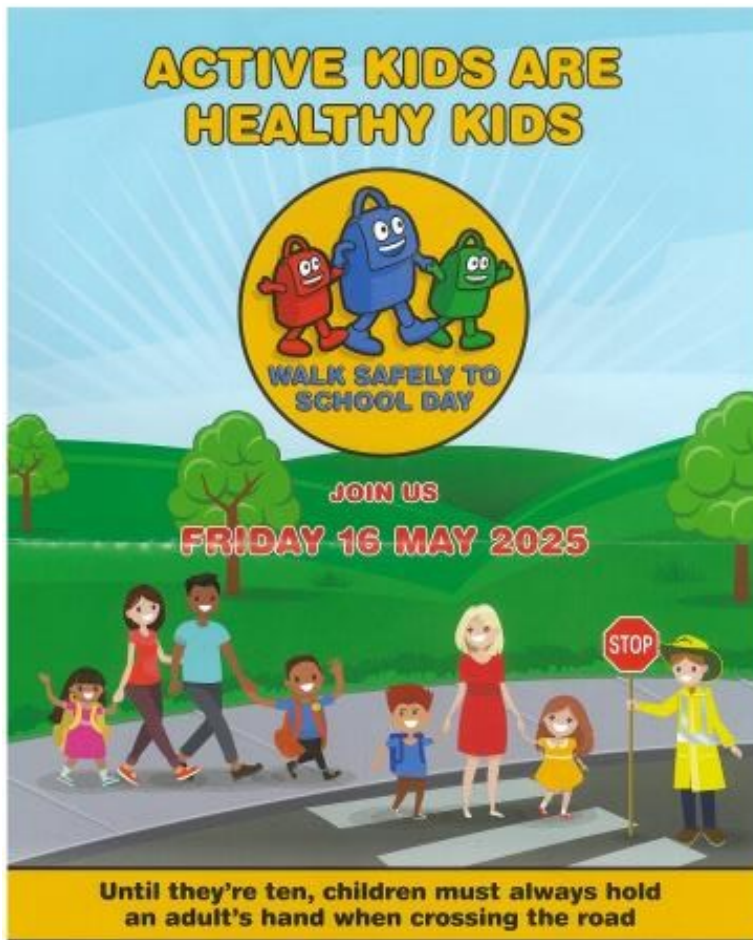
