The term has begun with students and families undertaking Student Led Conversations, we hope these have complimented the Portfolios of Learning as part of our Semester 1 reports. These approaches to reporting encourage students to reflect on their learning, recognise their strengths, set goals, to discuss what they have learned and most importantly how they have grown as learners. They also allow students to be a part of this process with their families and teachers to support them.

The Portfolios of Learning and Student LEd Conversations are part of our transition to the new South Australian Curriculum for Public Education, to be implemented throughout 2027. The curriculum is built around three key elements: Knowledge (what students know), Capabilities (what students can do), and Dispositions (how students approach learning and life).

A key feature of the new curriculum are the Dispositions, these recognise that successful learners develop positive habits, attitudes and ways of thinking that help them thrive both at school and beyond. There is a focus on twelve important dispositions: self-aware, community-minded, confident, creative, curious, empathetic, open-minded, reflective, resilient, resourceful, respectful and responsible. We believe that these Dispositions fit nicely with our school values.

These dispositions are intentionally developed through everyday learning experiences across all curriculum areas and through the life of our school. They help students become confident learners, effective problem-solvers and positive contributors to their communities.

This work builds on the strong foundations already in place at Port Broughton Area School. By combining academic achievement with the dispositions, we are preparing our students to be respectful, resilient and successful learners both now and into the future.

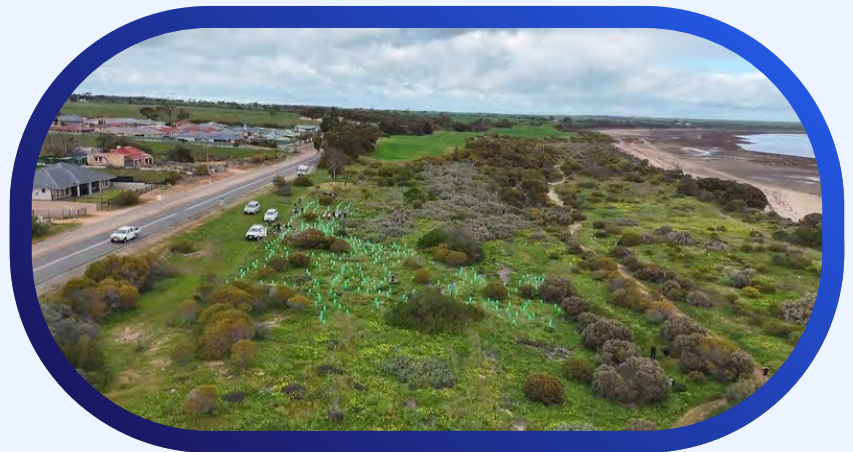

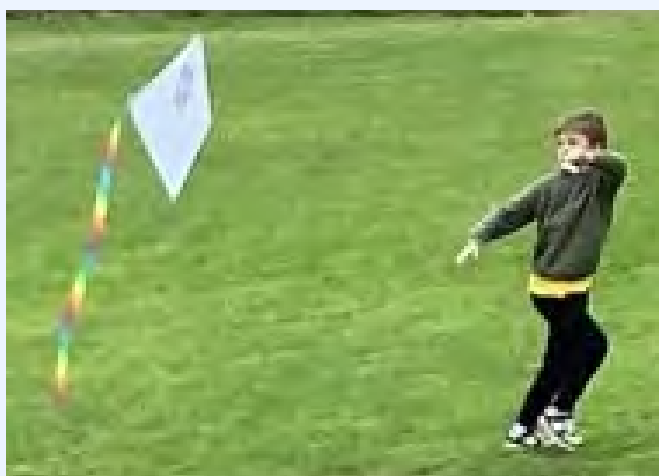


Library News

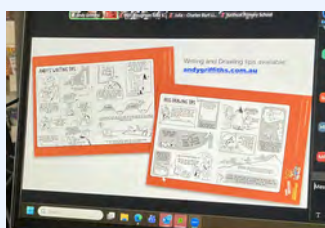


MYSTERY READERS

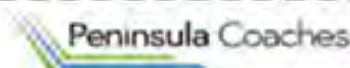

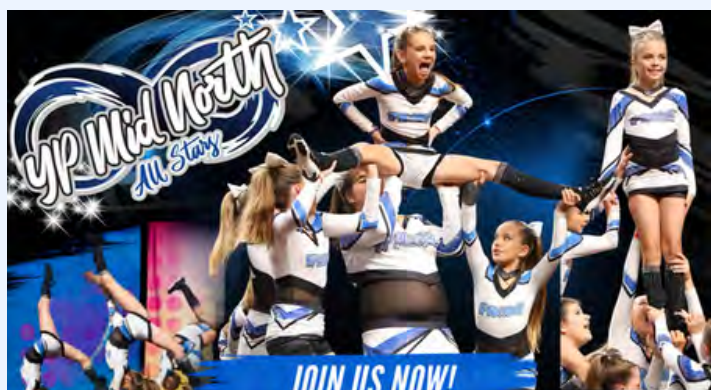
